The Oregon DATA Project is offering a two-day certification training for people interested in teaching others how to use data to improve student achievement. The session is designed to provide K-12 and ESD staff with the knowledge and tools needed to conduct meaningful training and provide follow-up support on effective use of data.

The session will hone participants' skills as trainers while deepening their knowledge of data analysis strategies at a building and classroom level. All of the resources needed to conduct the training will be provided, along with tips on how to modify training materials based on time, participants' skills and school type.

The training is offered free to those in districts participating in the project's Sustainability or Implementation efforts; if you do not know your status, ask your ESD. This is an intensive training, and **participants are required to attend pre-training study sessions hosted by regional ESDs**. See the following page for information on the study sessions.
