The Oregon DATA Project is offering a two-day certification training for people interested in teaching others how to use data to improve student achievement. The session is designed to provide K-12 and ESD staff with the knowledge and tools needed to conduct meaningful training and provide follow-up support on effective use of data.

The training is offered free to those in districts participating in the project's Sustainability efforts; if you do not know your status, ask your ESD. This is an intensive training, and participants are required to participate in a pre-session study group that requires about 15 hours of online work. (Study group information is available when registering for the certification session).

The certification session will hone participants' skills as trainers while deepening their knowledge of data analysis strategies at a building and classroom level. All of the resources needed to conduct the training will be provided, along with tips on how to modify training materials based on time, participants' skills and school type.
